INSTALLATION

NOTE: After installing the driver, set the correct data rate using a frequency of 14.745 MHz or by using the automatic frequency detection function.

5 V Jumper Setting for each RS-232 Port

- 5 V DC on Pin 9 of DB9 connector = 5 V short.
- Normal RI function on Pin 9 of DB9 connector = RI short.

Windows 9X/Me

- 1. Turn off the computer.
- 2. Insert the Serial PCI Card into an available PCI slot.
- 3. Turn the computer back on.
- 4. When the Install Wizard displays "Found New Hardware" message, select "Specify the location of the driver (Advanced)"; insert the driver CD in the CD-ROM drive; click "Next."
- Confirm that "Search for the best driver for your device (Recommended)" and "Specify a location" are both selected. De-select any other options and enter "E:\" (or whatever letter designates the drive); click "Browse."
- Specify a location; for example, "E:\PCI IO Host\OXmPCI\Windows." Click "OK"; click "Next."
- 7. When the wizard indicates that it found a driver for the device, click "Next." Then click "Finish" to exit the wizard.
- 8. Repeat Steps 4–7.
- 9. Once the driver is installed, click "Yes" to restart the computer.

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Windows 9X/Me Installation Verification & Frequency Setting

- 1. Right-click My Computer on the desktop, then select "Properties" and click on the Device Manager tab.
- Double-click "Multifunction adapters." If no yellow exclamation point (!) or question mark (?) appears in front of "OX16PCI954 PCI UARTs (unique bars)" or "OX16PCI95x PCI bridge," the driver has started properly.
- Double-click "Ports." If no yellow exclamation point (!) or question mark (?) appears in front of "PCI Communications Port (COM3)" or (COM4–6, as per Step 8 below) — the driver has started properly.
- 4. To view information about devices attached to the controller, rightclick "PCI Communications Port (COM3)" and click "Properties."
- 5. Click on the Data Rate tab. On the Input Clock panel, enter "14.7456" in the "Crystal Frequency" field or select "Automatic Crystal Detection."
- 6. In the Baud Rate Generation options panel, select "User Defined Override Speed."
- 7. In the Override Configuration panel, position the speed bar controller to the correct baud rate.
- 8. Repeat Steps 4-7 to set COM4, COM5 and COM6.

Windows NT 4.0

- 1. Turn on the computer.
- 2. Insert the driver CD into the CD-ROM drive.
- 3. Browse the driver CD and specify a location; for example, "E:\PCI IO Host\OXmPCI\Windowsexe\NT4_Serial."
- 4. Double-click "Install_Serial."
- 5. When "Windows NT4 Device Installer" displays, click "Next."
- 6. When "OxSer.INF" displays, select "Install"; then click "Next" and "Yes."
- 7. When "The operation was completed successfully and the driver has been started" displays, click "Exit."

Windows NT 4.0 Installation Verification & Frequency Setting

- 1. Right-click Start on the desktop, then select "Settings" and "Control Panel."
- Double-click "Ports"; select a COM port (e.g., "COM3"). The driver has started correctly.



Windows 2000/XP

- 1. Turn off the computer.
- 2. Insert the Serial PCI Card into an available PCI slot.
- 3. Turn the computer back on.
- 4. Insert the driver CD in the CD-ROM drive.
- 5. When the Install Wizard displays the window with a "Found New Hardware" message, click "Next."
- Select "Search for a suitable driver for my device (Recommended)"; click "Next."
- 7. Confirm that "Specify a location" is the only option selected; click "Next."
- 8. Enter "E:\" (or whatever letter designates the drive); click "Browse."
- 9. Specify a location; e.g., "E:\PCI IO Host\OXmPCI\Windows." Click "OK."
- 10. When the wizard indicates that it found a driver for the device, click "Next." Then click "Finish" to exit the wizard.
- 11. Repeat Steps 5-10.

- Double-click "Ports." If no yellow exclamation point (!) or question mark (?) appears in front of "PCI Communications Port (COM3)" or (COM4–6, as per Step 7 below) — the driver has started properly.
- 4. To view information about devices attached to the controller, rightclick "PCI Communications Port (COM3)" and click "Properties."
- 5. Click on the Data Rate tab. On the Input Clock panel, enter "14.7456" in the "Crystal Frequency" field or select "Automatic Crystal Detection."
- 6. In the Baud Rate Generation options panel, select "Use default baud rate."
- 7. Repeat Steps 4-6 to set COM4, COM5 and COM6.
